

Rubbish, rubbish, rubbish!

But space isn't the only problem with landfill sites, they give off nasty gases that cause global warming and smelly liquids that can pollute our soils and water.

So it has become very urgent for us to deal with our rubbish properly in Britain and Wirral. There are 3 main ways to do this;

A Bum Deal - Nappy Recycling

Let's do the Mathematics - If we assume that a baby is changed on average 5 times a day and the baby is in nappies for 30 months then the total number of disposable nappies required would be 4,562. The number of modern cotton nappies required is 48. This not only saves trees and landfill space, but if they are washed at home it can save up to £600 a year for each baby including utility bills and washing powder.

But lets' face it - these are busy times! If Mums and Dads don't think they have time to wash the cotton nappies, then you can use a local professional nappy laundering service.

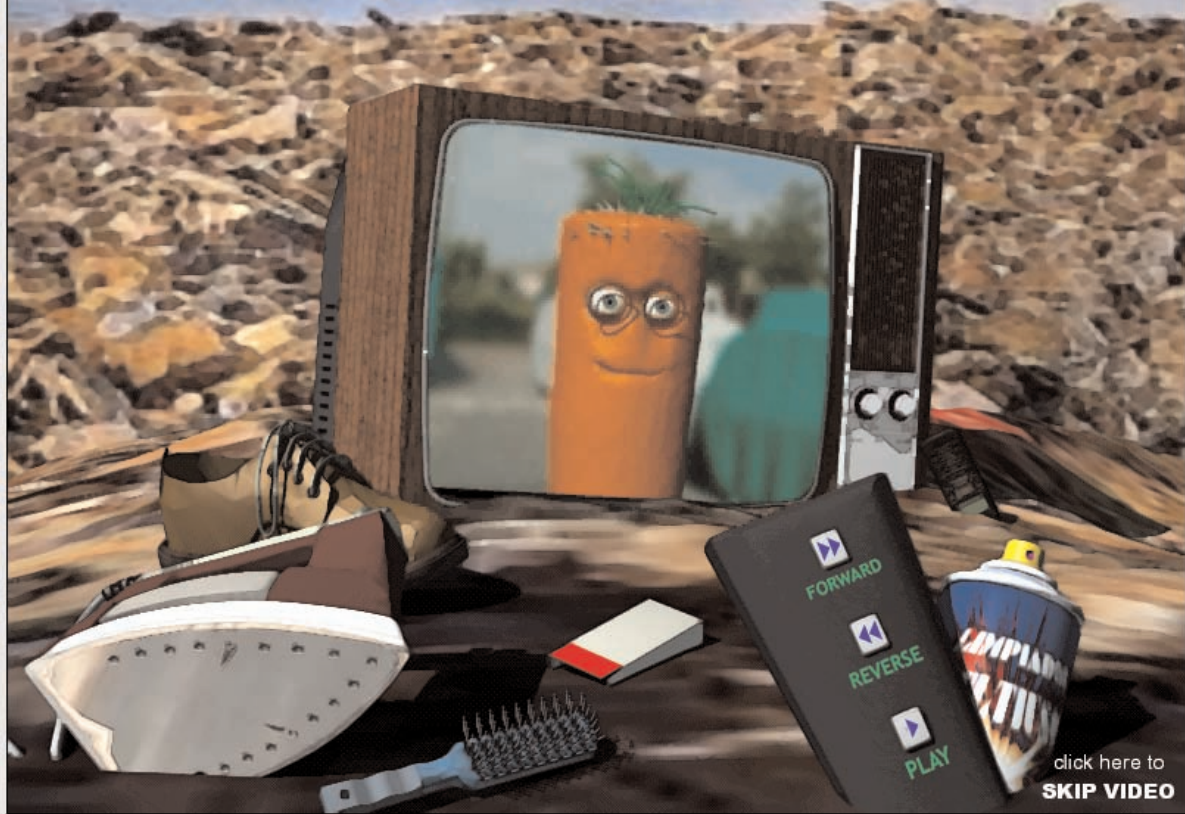
They can provide you with as many modern cotton nappies as you require, usually about 40-60 per week. They can supply various sized nappies to cater for your growing child. They also collect the dirty nappies every week and at the same time deliver a freshly laundered supply. All this at a reasonable weekly charge, which can generally cost less than continually buying disposables.
